**Sub: - War against Nation by Pakistan & Bangladesh.**

Sir,

We draw your kind attention to our earlier letter dated 30/07/2008 written after the serial bomb blasts in Ahmedabad and Bangalore. It is often suggested that 'extraordinary situations require extraordinary actions'.

Your goodself will agree that India is passing through an extraordinary context of history and without dwelling much on the background, please let us state directly that our survival as a nation has been challenged like never before by the dastardly attack of the enemy during last week in Mumbai, following the incidents of terrorism in the recent years like the attack on the Parliament, places of worship and serial blasts in public places in all important cities.

**When the enemy besieges a nation, it is the prelude to war. When the enemy attacks from a distance, it is war. But when the enemy enters our home and begins to decimate us from within the walls of our abode, it is more than a war - it is occupation.** NCCL truly hope that the Prime Minister recognizes that the enemy has occupied us and is scouring us from within. The context now is not of defending ourselves. It is rather a situation where we are provoked and challenged to survive and to liberate ourselves from the evil occupation.

We don't need the great resources that are commanded by the Nation's Intelligence Agencies to realize that almost every city of India is now infiltrated by terrorist entities of Pakistan and Bangladesh origins. The infiltration is deep and widespread. Terrorist elements have been operating from every part of the country and possibly from within the agencies that are entrusted with our trust to protect us. And the disappointment is that these are times of despair and lack of confidence in the system of Governance that we have collectively installed to protect our interests and take us to meet our tryst with the destiny.

Mr. Prime Minister, either the mechanism of Governance in the country is hopelessly weak OR we are an impotent nation. Either of this is true, in view of what has continued to happen amidst us. If we were not patriotic and filled with national spirit, it could have been believed that the nation is impotent. But since each of us is equally patriotic and is ready for martyrdom if necessary, it is as clear as water that the system of Governance is incompetent, having failed to provide the faintest confidence to its people about its ability to safeguard the nation from the occupied warfare of terrorists. The Mumbai massacre was not a lesser or local challenge and as such, any failure on this count is a reflection of the top leadership that you have had in the Government.

But in spite of this enormous disgrace that this Government has attracted to itself, if you want to continue to lead us, please show us some guts, bold action and commitment to protect us. It is important to derive inspiration from what the Israeli Foreign Minister has mentioned; he termed the death of five of his compatriots in Mumbai as **"an attack of the enemy on the Israeli State"**. The President-elect of USA declared, **"India has a right to attack Pakistan"**. The people of India the Parliament have time and again brought to the fore the

problem of Bangladeshi insurgency in India. But you seem to understand and interested in only the economic situation, giving us an impression that you could protect this country through the Reserve Bank of India and not through the competent Military might that has been tempered and seasoned for a situation like this.

As we mentioned earlier, these are extraordinary times requiring extraordinary action. The Nation is occupied and is crying the tears of survival. There is international consensus and support to India that any military action to protect us is justified and necessary. **The people of the country are angry and are demanding the freedom of existence that has been promised by our history. As a leader of the people of India, you are required and expected to act now and liberate the country from these aberrations of destiny.** The need for civil liberty of our people demands that the Government takes the following priority actions in respect of Pakistan and Bangladesh:

1. Destroying the terrorist camps and outfits in Pakistan, Bangladesh and the PoK.
2. Curtailment of all cultural and trade exchanges involving sports, arts, science etc.
3. Discontinuation of all transport links, such as air, road, rail and water.
4. Suspension of diplomatic relations and exchange.
5. Consolidation of international support to the cause of India at various fora, such as the United Nations and the Regional bodies.
6. Review, refinement and enhancement of India's military arsenal and civil deployment of security infrastructure.

Please Mr. Prime Minster, save this nation from its historic disgrace.
